ewcastle has always been a city of innovation and progress. At the height of the industrial age, the River Tyne was the 'workshop of the world' – producing trains, ships and engines that powered industries the world over, and have had a lasting and profound impact. A new dawn of housing in Newcastle

Newcastle is one the best cities in the world to live, work, study and visit – bursting with culture, opportunity and people who are passionate about the place they call home.

Investment in housing has significant wider benefits, enabling people to live healthy, happy lives, build strong inclusive communities and drive inclusive growth that benefits all residents.

At the end of 2023, Newcastle City Council's cabinet listened to residents and announced the proposal to bring housing back into the council. The transfer of Your Homes Newcastle, with almost 25,000 homes in the portfolio is underway and due to be completed by July 2024.

A new housing and communities directorate



will lead on the city's social housing and housing strategy and the search is on for a talented person capable of leading Newcastle City Council's social housing revolution.








with our overarching priorities of inclusive economy, anti-poverty and net zero, delivering a housing strategy and tackling homelessness.
